

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## Across

- an active, volitional responsibility that God commands of men; namely, the voluntary change of mind on the part of the sinner in which he turns from his sin.
- the voluntary act of turning from sin in "repentance toward God, and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ" (Acts 20:21; 1 Thess. 1:9).
- In the NT, this word is frequently used to refer to the sovereign act of God which effectually persuades the sinner to believe the gospel.
- an act of making a choice or decision
- the aspect of salvation which views the believer as being placed in the position of sonmanship to God.
- the free and sovereign act of God whereby He chose individuals, before the foundation of the world (Eph. 1:4) to become voluntary beneficiaries of His saving work, not out of any foreseen merit or faith but solely out of His own grace, and according to His own purpose (Rom. 9:11; 11:5; II Tim. 1:9).
- the overarching term for the divine act of delivering a believer from the power and penalty of sin, and restoring him to the fellowship with God for which he was originally created.


18. the exaltation of the believer to the position Christ earned for him - enthroned with Christ at God's side, ruling over all creation, endowed with eternal life (Rev. 3:21).
19. depicts salvation as God's purchase (by blood), deliverance (from the bondage of the law and its penalty, and of sin and its wages), and consequent ownership of the believer.
20. The word used for the removal of sin from a sinner - cleansing.
21. the objective, judicial act of God whereby He declares a man in right standing with Him, free from all guilt and penalty of sin.
22. the appeasement/satisfaction and consequent removal of God's righteous wrath upon the sinner through the substitutionary sacrifice of Christ (Luke 18:13; Rom. 3:25; Heb. 2:17; 9:13-15; I John 2:2; 4:10).
23. the bringing of man, the enemy and offender, back into a right relationship of peace with God, the offended one (Rom. 5:10-11; II Cor. 5:18-20; Eph. 2:16; Col. 1:20-21).

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2. primarily an OT word, indicating a covering-over of sin. In the NT it expresses the whole transaction of Christ's work on the cross.
3. includes both intellectual assent to specific facts (belief) and emotional/volitional commitment to the personal reality and ramifications of those facts (trust).
4. the objective/positional and subjective/practical process of a believer's becoming actually holy and Christlike
5. the active compassion of God toward needy and helpless man, which prompted Him to do for us what we could not do for ourselves (Eph. 2:4; Titus 3:5; I Pet. 1:3).
6. forgiveness; that is, the dismissal of sins or offenses on the basis of the substitutionary sacrifice of Christ.
8. God's pre-determined destiny for believers of (1) adoption as sons (Eph. 1:5) and (2) ultimate conformity to the image of Jesus Christ (Rom. 8:29); it is biblically distinct from election.
10. God's free goodness and favor shown toward undeserving man (Rom. 3:24; 5:20; Eph. 1:6-7; 2:4-8)
12. from a verb meaning "to account, reckon, attribute, credit; the charging or crediting to one's account as the ground of judicial treatment."
14. the objective (divine) side of the salvation experience. It is entirely God's act (John 1:13), through the agency of the Holy Spirit (Titus 3:5), and by means of the Scripture.
15. the necessary nature of Christ's atonement, in which He suffered not only for the benefit of, but in behalf of and in the place of sinners.
