Day 1 - Gen. 1-3 • Genesis chapters 1-2 tell about the creation of the world. Genesis 3 details the fall of man.

How did the Lord God create the first man and woman?

Day 2 - Gen. 4:1-6:8 • Genesis chapters 4-5 detail the descendants of Adam, all the way to Noah. Adam had a third son named Seth, who was the great-great-great-great-great-grandfather of Noah.

What is unique about Enoch, per Gen. 5:22-24?

Day 3 - Gen. 6:9-9:29 • Genesis 6 records the dimensions of the ark. If a cubit was approximately 18 inches, a vessel of this size could carry 14,000 tons - equivalent to 522 standard railroad stock cars. There are 17,600 species of animals today, meaning that Noah took approx. 45,000 animals into the ark. Genesis 7:11 records that fountains of the great deep (ground water) burst open in addition to the floodgates of the sky (rain) resulting in the Flood. After the Flood, God established a covenant with Noah and with his descendants after him in Genesis 9. The rainbow is the sign of this covenant.

What is the Noahic covenant?

Day 4 - Gen. 10-11 • Since the Flood, all the people of the world descended from the three sons of Noah.

Which of God's commands in Genesis 9:1 did the people defy in building the Tower of Babel (Gen. 11:4)?

Day 5 - Gen. 12-14 • In Genesis 12 God called Abram to relocate from Ur to Canaan, a distance of approx. 1,500 miles. In Genesis 14 Melchizedek king of Salem, who is a type of Christ (Hebrews 7), meets Abram. Melchizedek, who was a priest of God Most High (Gen 14:18), blessed Abram.

What issue caused Abram and his nephew Lot to separate in Genesis 13?

Day 6 - Gen. 15-17 • God details his covenant with Abraham in Genesis 15:1-21. This covenant was first mentioned in Genesis 12:2-3 and later repeated in Gen. 17:4-6.

What is the Abrahamic covenant?

Day 7 - Gen. 18-19 • The destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah are recorded in Genesis chapters 18-19. Archaeological discoveries reveal the existence of a flourishing civilization in Palestine between the 21st and 19th centuries B.C., savagely destroyed at the end of that period. Deposits of brimstone (sulphur) and fire have also been found in this area (Gen. 19:24).

Who visited Lot in the city of Sodom just prior to its destruction?

Day 8 - Gen. 20-22 •

Why did Abraham tell a lie to Abimilech king of Gerar in regard to Sarah?

Day 9 – Gen. 23-24 • The marriage of Isaac is recorded in Genesis 24. How old was Isaac when he got married and who did he marry (Gen. 25:20)?

Day 10 – Gen. 25-26 • Abraham took another wife, Keturah, whom bore to him six additional sons. Many of these sons have been identified with various Arab tribes. Isaac repeats the sin of his father in telling a lie to Abimilech king of Gerar.

What are the names of the twins born to Isaac and Rebekah, and what did the Lord tell Rebekah about them?

Day 11 – Gen. 27-28 • Jacob tells a lie to his father Isaac in order to receive his blessing. Esau marries a third wife, a descendant of Ishmael. Jacob flees to Haran and stays with his uncle Laban.

What did the Lord tell Jacob in his dream at Bethel?

Day 12 – Gen. 29-30 • Jacob marries Leah and Rachel. Jacob served Laban seven years for Rachel, but they seemed to him but a few days because of his love for her. Jacob, the deceiver, did not love Leah (Gen. 29:31) but was tricked by Laban into marrying Leah.

List the names of the children of Jacob, in separate lists including the name of their mother.

Day 13 – Gen. 31-32 • Jacob and his family return to Canaan. Jacob was crippled while wrestling one night (Gen. 32:24-31).

Who did Jacob wrestle with, and what was he told?

Day 14 – Gen. 33-35 • Jacob is reconciled with his brother Esau after forty years. Simeon and Levi avenge the rape of Dinah. Jacob built an altar to God at Bethel, purging all remnants of heathen practices in his household. Rachel dies while giving birth to another son. Isaac (Jacob's father) dies at the age of 180.

What are meanings of the names Jacob and Israel?

Day 15 – Gen. 36-37 • Genesis 36 lists the descendants of Esau. Joseph is sold into slavery in Genesis 37.

Why did Joseph's brothers hate him so much that they could not speak to him on friendly terms?
