The reader of Proverbs is cautioned four times (6:1, 11:15, 17:18, 22:26) against becoming liable for the financial obligations of another. Surety is another word for being a cosigner, one responsible for a debt should the borrower default. If someone asks you to cosign a loan for them, you should not do it unless you have the means and the desire to repay the loan on their behalf one day. Two other verses (20:16, 27:13) advise one to take some collateral if you become surety for a stranger.

Proverbs 25-29 contain proverbs of Solomon, arranged by an editorial committee set up by King Hezekiah.<sup>1</sup>

God conceals some things in His government of the universe, but kings need to investigate fully in order to make right decisions.<sup>1</sup> (Proverbs 25:2)

Faithful are the wounds of a friend, as iron sharpens iron. (Proverbs 17:6 and 17:17) A loyal friend can encourage one to do right, and may identify character flaws needing attention.

Day 165 - Song of Solomon • Song of Solomon is the historical record of the romance of Solomon with a Shulammite woman. The rightful place of physical love, within marriage only, is clearly exhibited and honored. Over the course of his life, Solomon did not demonstrate the best example of marital devotion, for he had many wives and concubines. The experiences recorded in this book may reflect the only (or virtually the only) pure romance he had.<sup>1</sup>
