Day 273 - John 1:1-18; Mark 1:1; Luke 1:1-4; 3:23-38; Matthew 1:1-17 •

The genealogy of Matthew 1:1-17 is that of Joseph, Jesus' legal (though not natural) father. It establishes Jesus' claim and right to the throne of David.

The genealogy of Luke 3:23-38 is evidently that of Mary.¹

In John 1:1-18, the Greek word *logos* is translated "Word". *Logos* means "word, thought, concept, and the expressions thereof." Here it is applied to Jesus, who is all that God is and the expression of Him. In John 1:1, the Word (Christ) is said to be with God (i.e., in communion with and yet distinct from God) and to be God (ie., identical in essence with God).¹
